Be sure to bring proper identification when you come to vote! For more information about acceptable voter identification options visit: www.saskatchewan.ca/government/municipal-administration/elections/voting.

You are entitled to vote in our Municipal Election if,

- ☐ You are a Canadian Citizen on Election Day
- ☐ You are 18 years old on the day of the Election
- ☐ You must have resided in Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election
- ☐ You have resided in the municipality or on land now in the municipality for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election or
- ☐ You are the owner of assessable land situated in the municipality or of land now situated in the municipality for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

SNOW REMOVAL

Residents are reminded that one of the biggest hindrances we face in clearing streets is vehicles left parked for more than 48 hours. If you see a car which has not been moved in 48 hours, let our office know so we can take further action. When the equipment has to go around parked cars the snow accumulated may end up in the driveway. After a heavy snowfall ridges are sometimes unavoidable and inevitable. If you are unable to remove this ridge residents are encouraged to have someone lined up to have them removed. Please do your part by keeping vehicles moved in a timely manner and if possible, keeping them off of the street after a heavy snowfall. Also, please remove your Garbage & Recycle bins from the street **ASAP** after the bins have been emptied. If you have a residence that does not have a front driveway and you require a spot to be left clear of a snow pile for your garbage & recycle bins, **YOU ARE REQUIRED TO MARK THE AREA WITH A STAKE/ORANGE FLAG.** If the area is not marked, it will not be cleared.
